HERNDON NEIGHBORHOOD COLLEGE REGISTRATION UNDER WAY *Community Leadership Program Runs February 2 through March 16*

Herndon, VA (January 7, 2009) – Registration for the Herndon Neighborhood College, the Town of Herndon’s community leadership program, is currently under way. The seven week program features hands-on activities that build organizational, problem solving and leadership skills; participants apply these skills toward strengthening neighborhoods and promoting a strong sense of community.

The 2009 program will be held on Monday evenings, February 2 through March 16 from 6:30 – 9 p.m.; there will also be a workshop on Saturday, February 21, from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Evening meetings will include a light dinner, and breakfast and lunch will be provided at the Saturday workshop. All classes will be held at the Neighborhood Resource Center, 1086 Elden Street. There is no charge to attend the Neighborhood College.

“I encourage all citizens to take advantage of this unique leadership program,” said Mayor Steve DeBenedittis. “The Herndon Neighborhood College is hands-on, informative and fun – and it equips graduates with the skills they need to assume leadership positions within their neighborhoods and throughout the town.”

Through a combination of lectures, group discussions, role-playing and field work, participants learn how to run effective meetings; influence local government programs and

impact the decision-making process; navigate cross-cultural dynamics; access Town of Herndon and Fairfax County services; and organize communities into action.
